The location

The semi-urban district of Rewari (900,000 inhabitants) is situated some 80 kilometres south-west of New Delhi, in India. Despite the spectacular economic growth in the region, the condition of the 'lower' castes remains precarious and thousands of 'untouchables' find themselves obliged to sort rubbish in order to survive.



Our local partners

Robin and Angeleena Masih have been running Rewari International since 1985. The aim of this association is to destroy the cycle of poverty by giving a chance to the most disadvantaged members of the population and by applying long-term solutions which are appropriate to Indian culture. A particular emphasis is placed on the support of whole families. Rewari International has been supported by Belgians since 1991, and in partnership with SEL Projets since 2009.

Based Belgium, SEL Projets is a Christian non profit-making organisation which works in the areas of development and emergency aid. Its aim is to offer practical help to the most vulnerable people in co-operation with trustworthy local partners. (In Hindi, 'avasara' means 'chance')

The different activities of Rewari International aim to restore human dignity by bringing a holistic response to the specific needs of 'low caste' families, in the context of warm and trustful relationships.

EDUCATION

In the five tutorial centres, hundreds of children are able to receive some basic education (reading, writing and arithmetic) and general support for their learning.

The Good Shepherd School offers a good quality of education to children from many different backgrounds, including some from very poor families. In the long run the school will become self-financing thanks to the school fees which are paid by the slightly 'wealthier' families.

MEDICAL CARE

Thanks to the mobile dispensary unit, the medical team is able to move around providing medical care and health education to neglected communities. This helps them to cope with all sorts of seasonal illnesses.

EMERGENCY RELIEF

Our partners make regular distributions of food parcels, clothes and blankets to the deprived communities, according to their needs and the weather conditions.
